## Isaiah 58--My Ultimate Goal

This past November marked the 20th anniversary of our (the McIntyres) full time ministry with WAMM. And though many things have changed in our lives and ministry during that time, one thing has remained the same. Our goal in starting this ministry has been to give you an opportunity to live out Isaiah 58.

This was the passage of Scripture that God used to direct my heart into mercy ministry. God insists in this chapter that those involved in extending mercy to those in need would benefit in their Worship, their Witness and their Walk with Christ. I wanted that for me, but I also wanted that for other children of God—people like you.

Now it may seem strange to hear that this was my ultimate goal in establishing this ministry. I suspect that many would assume my ultimate goal was extending mercy to the orphaned and at-

risk children in West Africa as our name might suggest. But in reality, mercy ministry has always been a means to enhancing my relationship with Jesus and affording others the same opportunity.

One might say that extending mercy was my penultimate goal while growing in relationship with Jesus was my ultimate one.

And isn't it just like God to develop a system where both of these lofty goals can be met in one "scheme" (that is the word Ghanaians use to speak of a plan, system or strategy).

"HERE I AM." ISAIAH 58:9

God's mercy to those in need, we are also working to enhance our worship of, our testimony for, and our intimacy with Jesus. Talk about a Win/Win!

WAMM started 20 years ago with this goal in mind. I want it to motivate our next 20 years as well.

This is Charity. She is 3 years old and has just begun going to school! She absolutely loves it!

Charity was abandoned at the hospital as an infant. She was born with only 1 leg and with her intestines on the outside of her body. At 2 weeks of age, Ghana Social Welfare asked us to help with her hospital bills and care. We agreed. After 6 months in the hospital, they asked us to take her into our care at HOMe. Priscilla shares that Charity is quite independent. She wants to do everything by herself. The girl can cruise around on that 1 leg without her artificial limb and crutches like nobody's business. It is quite something to see!

At this time, Charity is ½ sponsored by 3 faithful sponsors. We need and additional \$150.00/month for her to be fully sponsored. Sponsorship allows us to give loving care to each child at HOMe physically, spiritually, medically and educationally.

## **Meeting Halfway**



I have shared with you in the past that we are looking for a church or team of churches to partner with Pastor Paul Adin in planting a church in Pakro, Ghana. This has not happened yet, though we continue to pray toward that end.

In the meantime, my friend has become "impatient" so he and a couple of leaders from their church in Nsawam have begun meeting with a group of people for a Bible study on Tuesday Evenings. Currently 8 adults attend faithfully and about 15 children also come. Their goal is to begin Sunday Services this Easter.

But one thing has changed. The roads, as I have shared with you be-

fore, are terrible for traveling to Pakro. Since my last update, the roads have worsened, making travel almost impossible. So They have begun meeting in the village of Odeikrom, one village closer to Nsawam. Hence the title of this article. Paul and the team from HCBC travel to Odeikrom where people from Pakro meet them, having traveled on foot.

There presence, then, brings danger of that curse affecting the families in the community. This party seems to have eased those fears.
