When working with children with special needs, one can wonder how much is being caught cognitively. This game gave Debbie and me great encouragement. As Patrick came up with person after person.

The last one went something like this. Patrick hinted, "This man is in the Bible and it was a man who supposed to preach but he ran away."

I am happy to say Debbie guessed Jonah. I am happier to say that Patrick remembered this story on his own, no prompting. What it did prompt was a question from Debbie. "Partick, do you know that God loves you."

Patrick's response, in absolute sincerity was, "Yes, I know he does."

Now that may seem a bit trite to some of you, but we took great delight in hearing this little one proclaiming with great assurance his confidence in God's love for him.

After this episode, Isaac went back to being his disinterested self. What this did for Debbie and me, however, is to offer hope that somewhere inside this young man is the potential to respond as a typical child would respond—that affection is not undesired but simply very difficult for him to express.

Whatever the case, Debbie loved it and we thank God for this unsolicited and totally unexpected physical display of affection.
